



California Nurses Association~ \$33 Million Cash Surplus

How the Union Got Rich Overcharging Nurses

For the past several years, CNA has collected much more revenue from nurses than it has spent. For example, in the union's last fiscal year (7/1/2007 – 6/30/2008), they collected over \$58 million in dues, but they spent only \$49 million.

In other words, CNA has been overcharging nurses millions each year, and now they are sitting on \$33 million in cash.

These figures come from the [LM-2 financial disclosure form](#) filed by CNA with the U.S. Department of Labor in September of 2008.

The CNA's Greed Overrides Nurses' Needs

Even though CNA keeps building huge surpluses from the excessive dues it charges nurses, the union has not made any attempt to reduce its dues rate, or provide any type of rebate for its members.

In these difficult economic times, when everyone can use some help, CNA instead keeps taking more money from nurses and hoarding it, without even considering the needs of its members.
